

**Tropical Storm Allison

June 18th 2001**

**Current Situation**

The Capital Area Chapter of the American Red Cross continues with recovery efforts throughout Leon County. Flooding in southern Leon County has receded. Hours of operation this week will be 8:00AM until 6:00PM.

A Presidential Disaster Declaration for Individual Assistance was made on June 17th. The declaration was for Leon County (where 99.9% of the damage is) and the contiguous counties of Gadsden, Liberty, Wakulla and Jefferson.

The State of Florida plans to open a Disaster Recovery Center at the North Florida Fair Grounds on July 19th. This Disaster Relief Operation will have a presence at the Disaster Recovery Center to provide recovery and mitigation information and refer disaster victims to the Service Center if assistance is needed.

The State of Florida will deploy three Community Relation Teams into Leon County on June 19th. This Disaster Relief Operation will have a presence on all three teams to provide recovery and mitigation information and refer disaster victims to the Service Center if assistance is needed

**Mass Care**

As of COB June 17th 704 meals have been provided to victims and emergency workers.

As of COB June 16th 405 Comfort Kits have been distributed to victims.

No shelters are open or on standby.

No Emergency Aid Station are open or on standby.

No mobile feeding routes are open.

The only feeding operations are in support of the Disaster Relief Operations staff.

217 cases of bottled water have been distributed. Bottled water will continue to be made available to residents of southern Leon County from our office at 187 Office Plaza Dr, Tallahassee FL.

**Damage Assessment**

As of COB June 17th Detailed Damage Assessment is 100% completed. Detailed Damage Assessment Summary remains unchanged at:

Single Family: Destroyed: 2 - Major: 78 - Minor: 215

Mobile Homes: Destroyed: 2 - Major: 14 - Minor: 19

Apartments: Destroyed: 4 - Major: 96 - Minor: 127

Total affected dwelling units: 546

### **Family Services**

On June 17th five Outreach Teams were dispatched into the field along with the Damage Assessment Teams. As of COB June 17th 149 901s (case records) have been opened via Outreach Teams and the Service Center with referrals and financial assistance being provided. Today five Outreach Teams are assigned to the field.

Activity at the Service Center is very slow. Family Services Technicians and Supervisors are reviewing cases for call backs and possible closure.

No Outreach Teams are active in the field today because most disaster victims have returned to their jobs.

Referrals are being made to the Florida Baptist Association and Killlearn United Methodist Church for clean up assistance.

### **Health Services**

Health Services (Nurses) Technicians are located at the Service Center.

### **Mental Health Services**

Disaster Mental Health Services Technicians are on call to support the Service Center.

### **Staffing**

As of COB June 17th 133 Disaster Services Volunteer and Paid Staff Members have been assigned to the Disaster Relief Operation.
