Current Situation

The Capital Area Chapter of the American Red Cross continues with recovery efforts throughout Leon County. Hours of operation this week will be 8:00AM until 6:00PM.

The State of Florida Department of Community Affairs plans to open a Disaster Recovery Center within the next day or at a location to be determined in the next several days. This Disaster Relief Operation will have a presence at the Disaster Recovery Center to provide recovery and mitigation information and refer disaster victims to the Service Center if assistance is needed.

The State of Florida Department of Community Affairs and the Federal Emergency Management Agency have deployed three Community Relation Teams into Leon County again today. This Disaster Relief Operation has a presence on all three teams providing recovery and mitigation information and referring disaster victims to the Service Center if assistance is needed.

Mass Care

As of COB June 19th 762 meals have been provided to victims and emergency workers. Currently the only feeding is to provide lunch, snacks and drinks for staff members assigned to this Disaster Relief Operation.

As of COB June 19th 419 Comfort Kits have been distributed to victims.

No shelters are open or on standby.

No Emergency Aid Stations are open or on standby.

No mobile feeding routes are open.

217 cases of bottled water have been distributed to date. Bottled water continues to be made available to residents of southern Leon County from our office at 187 Office Plaza Dr, Tallahassee FL.

Damage Assessment

As of COB June 19th Detailed Damage Assessment is 100% completed. Detailed Damage Assessment Summary remains unchanged at:

Single Family: Destroyed: 2 - Major: 80 - Minor: 241
Mobile Homes: Destroyed: 5 - Major: 14 - Minor: 19
Apartments: Destroyed: 3 - Major: 97 - Minor: 139

Total affected dwelling units: 600

Because of the widespread and spotty nature of the flooding we continue to find several new damage units each day. Most of this damage is very minor.

Family Services

On June 19th Outreach Teams were dispatched on an as needed bases into the field. As of COB June 19th 162 901s (case records) have been opened via Outreach Teams and the Service Center with referrals and financial assistance being provided.

Today June 20th Outreach Teams will only be dispatched on an as needed bases.

Family Services continues to concentrate on case record review and closure.
