PUBLIC HEALTH NOTICE

TALLAHASSEE— Due to the flooding from Tropical Storm Barry in and around the Oakridge Road area in southern Leon County and other affected areas, the private drinking water wells serving homes in those areas may be contaminated. If a well has been inundated by floodwaters you should assume that the bacteriological limits of Chapters 17-550 and 64E-8, Florida Administrative Code, For Safe Drinking Water, have been exceeded.

Therefore, as a precaution, the Leon County Health Department is issuing a **Precautionary Boil Water Notice** for all residents of Leon County served by private drinking water wells who have been affected by the flooding associated with Tropical Storm Barry.

We are advising that all water used for drinking or cooking be boiled. A rolling boil of one minute is sufficient. Bottled water may be used as an alternative.

This "**Precautionary Boil Water Notice**" will remain in effect until the floodwaters recede and a bacteriological survey shows that your water is safe to drink.
