

**Tropical Storm Barry
American Red Cross
Situation Report 7 August 12 2001**

Current Conditions

Flood water has begun to recede in the Munson Slough area of Leon County. This is currently the only area of concern for this Disaster Relief Operation.

While some homes are damaged from this flooding, the majority of the families who are effected in the Munson Slough area are isolated or can not use their water wells or septic tanks because of the flooding.

Mass Care (Sheltering and Feeding)

The following shelter is currently on stand-by for evacuees from the Munson Slough area:

A mobile Shower Unit has been established at the above listed shelter. As of this report 12 people have used the unit.

This shelter has been opened and closed five (5) times in the last six (6) days to support the housing needs of evacuees. To-date no one has been sheltered. Current plans are to keep the shelter on stand-by until the flood water has totally receded.

The Shelter Information Hotline at *ARC (272) on a mobile phone or 850/894-6741 on a landline is still activated.

Two (2) Mobile Feeding units are operational in the Munson Slough area of Leon County.

One (1) Emergency Aid Station remains operational at the corner of Oak Ridge Road and State Road 61. The following services are available snacks, drinks, meals, bottled water, comfort kits, well test kits and disaster preparedness / mitigation information.

This Emergency Aid Station is staffed by the following functions: Mass Care, Disaster Health Services and Disaster Mental Health Services.

Meals provided to-date: 2,890

Gallons of bottled water provided to-date: 6,480

Comfort Kits provided to-date: 296

Family Services

Family Services Outreach Teams have swept through all the known damaged areas with the exception of the flooded area of Munson Slough.

Currently one (1) Family Services Outreach Team is located at the shelter that is on stand-by. Casework is being provided for victims of the Munson Slough flooding on verified needs.

As of this report 25 Emergency Assistance cases have been opened during this Disaster Relief Operation.

Staffing

A total of 76 Disaster Services Staff Members have been assigned to this Disaster Relief Operation to-date. With 36 reporting in on Saturday August 11 2001.
