

**Tropical Storm Barry
American Red Cross
Situation Report 8 August 13 2001**

Current Conditions

Flood water continues to recede in the Munson Slough area of Leon County. This is currently the only area of concern for this Disaster Relief Operation.

While some homes are damaged from this flooding, the majority of the families who are effected in the Munson Slough area are isolated or can not use their water wells or septic tanks because of the flooding.

Mass Care (Sheltering and Feeding)

No shelters are currently on stand-by or open for evacuees from the Munson Slough area.

A Mobile Shower Unit continues operations at the Service Center located at:

Woodville Baptist Church
9500 Woodville Highway
Woodville Florida

Since Saturday August 11 2001 at 12:00PM a total of 42 people have used the Mobile Shower Unit.

Two (2) Mobile Feeding units are operational in the Munson Slough area of Leon County.

One (1) Emergency Aid Station remains operational at the corner of Oak Ridge Road and State Road 61. The following services are available snacks, drinks, meals, bottled water, comfort kits, well test kits and disaster preparedness / mitigation information.

This Emergency Aid Station is staffed by the following functions: Mass Care, Disaster Health Services and Disaster Mental Health Services.

Meals provided to-date: 3,896
Gallons of bottled water provided to-date: 7,023
Comfort Kits provided to-date: 332

Damage Assessment

One (1) Damage Assessment team is on stand-by today for Leon County. Because flood water remains somewhat high Damage Assessment is unable to complete the Detailed Damage Assessment.

Total Damage 81 units (1.3% Destroyed - 12.3 Major - 81.5% Minor)

Family Services

Family Services Outreach Teams have swept through all the known damaged areas with the exception of the flooded area of Munson Slough.

Currently two (2) Family Services Outreach Teams are located at the Service Center. Casework is being provided for victims of the Munson Slough flooding on verified needs.

As of this report 36 Emergency Assistance cases have been opened during this Disaster Relief Operation.

Staffing

A total of 78 Disaster Services Staff Members have been assigned to this Disaster Relief Operation to-date. With 25 reporting in on Sunday August 12 2001.
