

**Tropical Storm Barry
American Red Cross
Situation Report 9 August 14 2001**

Current Conditions

Flood water has recede another one to two feet in the Munson Slough area of Leon County. This is currently the only area of concern for this Disaster Relief Operation.

Because the flood water continues to recede the number of homes effected has begun to go down. There are an estimated 15 to 20 homes that may be damaged from the flooding, the majority of the families who are effected in the Munson Slough area are isolated or can not use their water wells or septic tanks because of the flooding.

Additional rain is expected today with the passing of a cold front.

Mass Care (Sheltering and Feeding)

No shelters are currently on stand-by or open for evacuees from the Munson Slough area.

A Mobile Shower Unit continues operations at the Service Center located at:

Since Saturday August 11 2001 at 12:00PM a total of 84 people have used the Mobile Shower Unit.

Two (2) Mobile Feeding units are operational in the Munson Slough area of Leon County.

One (1) Emergency Aid Station remains operational daily between the hours of 9:00AM and 7:00PM at the corner of Oak Ridge Road and State Road 61. The following services are available snacks, drinks, meals, bottled water, comfort kits, well test kits and disaster preparedness / mitigation information.

This Emergency Aid Station is staffed by the following functions: Mass Care, Disaster Health Services and Disaster Mental Health Services.

Meals provided to-date: 4,811
Gallons of bottled water provided to-date: 7,414
Comfort Kits provided to-date: 350

Clean-Up Kits will be delivered to the Service Center today.

Damage Assessment

One (1) Damage Assessment team is on stand-by today for Leon County. Because flood water remain somewhat high Damage Assessment is unable to complete the Detailed Damage Assessment. Plans are being developed to deploy one Damage Assessment team into the flood area on Wednesday August 14.

Family Services

Family Services Outreach Teams have swept through all the known damaged areas with the exception of the flooded area of Munson Slough.

Currently one (1) Family Services Outreach Team is located at the Service Center. The operational hours of the Service Center are 9:00AM until 6:00PM. Casework is being provided for victims of the Munson Slough flooding on verified needs.

Family Services was authorized to assist with septic tank pump out and water well decontamination.

As of this report 39 Emergency Assistance cases have been opened during this Disaster Relief Operation.

Staffing

A total of 82 Disaster Services Staff Members have been assigned to this Disaster Relief Operation to-date. With 33 reporting in on Monday August 13 2001.
