## Hurricane Jeanne

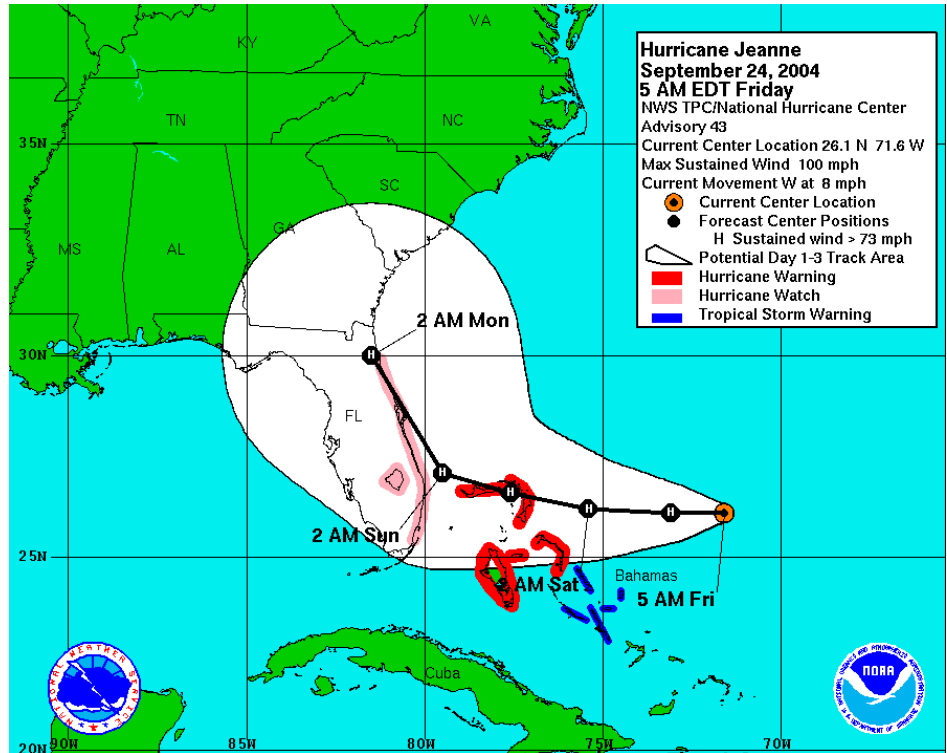

### CURRENT SITUATION

#### HURRICANE WATCH ISSUED FOR EAST FLORIDA COAST...A

Hurricane Watch is in effect along the east coast of Florida from Florida City to St. Augustine including Lake Okeechobee.

At 8 am EDT, the center of Hurricane Jeanne was located near latitude 26.1 north and longitude 72.0 west or about 315 miles east of Great Abaco Island in the Northwestern Bahamas. Jeanne is moving toward the west near 8 mph and this motion is expected to continue with some increase in forward speed during the next 24 hours. This motion could bring the center of Hurricane Jeanne near the Northwestern Bahamas on Saturday. Some slow strengthening is possible during the next 24 hours. Hurricane force winds extend outward up to 45 miles from the center and tropical storm force winds extend outward up to 140 miles.



### STATE ACTIONS

The SEOC is currently at a Level 1 Activation in response to Hurricanes Charley, Frances and Ivan. The State Emergency Response Team continues to monitor the progress of Hurricane Jeanne and prepares to respond in case of landfall on Florida's coast.
