**Situation Report # 5  
Thursday March 7th 2002 5:00PM**

**Administration**

The Capital Area Chapter's Emergency Operations Center at 187 Office Plaza Dr in Tallahassee has transitioned back to normal operations and hours. All future contact can be made directly with the Disaster Service Office at 878-6080.

**Mass Care**

No shelters are open at this time.

ERV # 1074 is currently stationed at the Emergency Aid Station at the corner of Oak Ridge Road and State Road 61 in southern Leon County. The following services remain available at the Emergency Aid Station: Meals, Snacks, Drinks, Bottled Water, Water Test Kits, Flood Safety and Mitigation Information.

ERV # II is on standby if needed to support this Disaster Relief Operation.

The hours of operation for the Emergency Aid Station will be from 9:00AM until 7:00PM daily.

397 cases of bottled water have been distributed to-date.

1,247 meals have been served to-date.

Feeding support for staff assigned to the Disaster Relief Operation continues.

**Damage Assessment**

Detailed Damage Assessment is 100% complete.

On-Line Damage Assessment has been deactivated as of 5:00PM today.

Street Sheet matrix has been distributed to City of Tallahassee and Leon County officials.

**Family Services**

One (1) Family Services team is stationed at the Emergency Aid Station

Twentyfive (25) emergency assistance cases have been opened, seven (10) of these cases have been closed with financial assistance while fifteen (15) of these cases have been closed with service only.

**Health Services**

Health Services is now on standby.

**Staffing**

A total of 51 Disaster Services Volunteers have been assigned to this Disaster Relief Operation to-date.

**Public Affairs**

One interview was conducted with Channel 27 - WTXL.

**Planning Assumptions**

The focus of this Disaster Relief Operation is centered on the Munson Slough area. The water levels in the Munson Slough area have continued to fall during the past 24 hours. Preliminary planning has the Emergency Aid Station activities transitioning back to the Chapter House on Saturday March 13.
